OA Publishing at Xamk

- Our APC processes aim to improve the impact of our work by making it openly available whenever possible.
 - These processes are designed to support scientific publishing.
 - The APC process is a partnership between Library Services (Information Specialists) and RDI Development Services (Publication Specialists & Language Specialists).
- We advise staff to primarily look for open publication channels that are covered by FinElib agreements or do not charge a fee.
 - Projects are encouraged to include APCs in their budget.
 - We have a limited centralised fund to cover APCs as a last resort.
 - The budget resets yearly.



APC process started in 2022

- 2022: Paid everything (books, articles, image rights, printing charges) until the budget was gone.
- 2023: We implemented some limited criteria for APCs and updated our guidance for staff.
- 2024: We conducted a review and made the criteria more restrictive to only pay for Peer Reviewed Articles.
 - We added <u>guidance to LibGuides</u> and re-wrote our intranet guidance in clearer language.



Current APC Process

- 1. The author completes a form before sending the article to the journal.
 - The same process applies if a project is paying for the APC.
 - All APCs are recorded in a common ledger account (kirjanpitotili) to track the amount we pay.
- 2. The query arrives in a joint Teams channel and Excel spreadsheet.
 - Library Services checks the FinElib agreements
 - Development Services reviews the publication and checks the budget.
- 3. If there are no discounts or fee waivers, or the publication channel looks predatory, we try to locate alternative channels where they can publish their article OA without charge.
- 4. If we agree to pay the fee, we allocate/reserve the money in the budget (e.g., for 2025 or 2026).
- The author is in contact with us throughout the publication process, and if there are delays or the article is rejected, we will reallocate the money accordingly.
- 6. The invoice is sent to process owner, checked, and forwarded to finance.
 - The budget spreadsheet is updated.
- The author reports the publication and APC amount in JUSTUS.



APC Criteria

- The article must be a peer-reviewed research article (publication type A1, A2, A3 in the Ministry of Education and Culture's publication data collection).
 - We do not pay printing or licensing costs (e.g., if the journal adds extra costs for colour printing).
 - We do not cover the open access publishing costs of scientific books (C1) or edited works (C2).
- The APC must be paid to the corresponding author, and they must have an active Xamk affiliation when submitting the article.
 - Authors with double affiliations (e.g., doctoral researchers) should ask their university for funding if the article is part of their dissertation.
- The journal must be open access or hybrid and of 'good' quality. For example:
 - JUFO, SNIP 1.0, the journal is included in DOAJ.
 - The journal's editorial board includes well-known researchers in the field.
 - The peer review process should be transparent and detailed on the journal's website.
- The article is published under a Creative Commons license.
- The article does not receive APC funding from a project or other sources.
- The amount of the APC fee must be reported in euros in the JUSTUS service.



Good Practices & Challenges

- Customer service mentality
 - Common publishing & language services form
 - Assisting the author in finding alternative "free" or discounted publication channels.
 - Involved in the publishing process early on.
 - · Identifying predatory publications.
- Scientific writing coaching
 - Support with writing articles and finding places to publish.
 - We usually edit the articles before publication and can intervene.
- Cooperation between library and development services.
- Guidance
 - Clear language when possible
 - Guides: APCs, licences, finding open & free journals, predatory publishing.

- Finding publication channels
 - More 'closed' channels are switching to an APC model and removing 'paywalled' options.
 - · Balancing act: free vs impact, cheap vs good
- Peer review & budget allocation
 - A year's budget might be entirely allocated by February, but we might end the year with a surplus.
 - Maintaining the common ledger account.
 - RDI Projects often finish before the APC is due.
- Terminology
 - · FinElib can be difficult to navigate
 - · Staff are heavily reliant on our services
- OA books & Finnish publications
 - Budget is mostly allocated to English language publications
